If you want to miss God's will...

Trust your <u>FEELINGS</u> above all else.

(<u>Genesis 3:6</u>, <u>1 Corinthians 4:4</u>, Proverbs 12:15, 14:12)

2 Look for A 'STRANGE SIGN' from God.

(<u>Judges 6:36-40</u>, <u>2 Thess 2:9</u>, 1 Jn 4:1-5, Ex 7:22, <u>2 Cor 11:14-15</u>)

**❸** Confuse <u>FAITH</u> with <u>OPTIMISM</u>.

(<u>Hebrews 11:6, 11:32-40, Daniel 3:1-28, Job</u>)

● Ignore <u>WISE COUNSEL</u>.

(Proverbs 15:22, 27:5-6, 27:17, 13:20, 12:15)
