Need: When the dream seems more fantacy than possible. When the dream is in limbo, where your not going anywhere.

Subject: Who do you do when you feel like the dream is not going anywhere?

Text: Genesis 40:1-23

THE DREAM CAUGHT IN LIMBO

When you feel like your dream is not going anywhere...

- Serve Others: Live beyond yourself (vs.1-8)
 - Ask, what next? Not, why this?
 - 2 Core Realities
 - 1. God is working in your circumstances.
 - 2. God is inviting you to join His work around you.
 - 2 Convicting Questions
 - Q1: Is there a need in this church that has your name on it?
 - Q2: Who are you helping make their dreams a reality?
 - As long as you are caught up in your dream, you're not going to help someone else make sense of theirs.
 - Who you help today may help you tomorrow
- 2 Share Your Faith: Connect people to the <u>Dream Giver</u>. (vs.8)

Don't Forget

- 1. God's plan for your friends and family is you.
- 2. The bridge that <u>truth</u> travels over is <u>relationships</u>.

- 3. People need answers, not arguments.
- **❸** <u>Be Known to Others</u>: Search and listen to <u>wise counsel</u> around you. (vs.9-13, 16-19)
 - Be Cautious: Weigh and test everything.
 - Stay Open: Sometimes God uses weird experiences.
 - Apply: The "one and done" rule.
 - 2 Probing Questions
 - 1. Am I asking the right people?
 - 2. Am I seeking advice or someone who agrees with me?
 - 2 Trustworthy Statements
 - 1. A dream caught in limbo doesn't always mean you made a wrong turn if God sent you there.
 - 2. A dream caught in limbo sometimes means you made a wrong turn if you disqualified yourself.
- On't Forget to Ask: It's always a no, unless you ask. (vs.14-15, 20-23)

I wish someone would have told me...

- 1. Sometimes you don't have because you didn't ask.
- 2. Sometimes we confuse God's "not yet" with a "no".
- 3. Sometimes we think we have a "not yet" when it's a "no"
