### LEADERSHIP LOST REHOBOAM'S THREE DUMB MISTAKES

- ► Forgot that <u>approach</u> matters 2 Chronicles 10:7,13/ Proverbs 15:1/Colossians 3:12-14/Galatians 5:22-25
  - Kindness is not a feeling but an action.
  - 2 Kindness always reflects God's character.
- ► Listening to <u>bad advice</u> I Kings 12:6-11
  - Am I asking the <u>right people</u>?
  - 2 Am I seeking advice or someone who agrees with me?
- ► Leading by <u>fear</u> & <u>intimidation</u> 1 Kings 12:12-19
  - Leaders who last always put the needs of others first
  - 2 Leaders who last are dependable & consistent

# REALife Application

**QUICK REVIEW -** Looking back over your sermon notes, which particular point or passage of Scripture most challenged, confused or caught your attention?

- 1. Look up the words "kind" and "kindness" in the concordance of your Bible. Pick 5-7 references from the New Testament and look at how the word is used. What do you see?
- 2. Define kindness. Is the Bible referring to personality traits in Col. 3:12-14, or character qualities? What is the difference between kindness and friendliness? How are they similar?
- 3. Read Eph. 2:1-7. How will God's grace be displayed in the coming ages? How has he expressed His kindness to us? Look at Isaiah 53:1-12. What does it look like to "cloth yourself" in kindness?
- 4. We also looked at the importance of seeking wise counsel when making decisions. One of the reasons to do so is to make sure we're not falling victim to our personal blind spots. What do the following verses have to say about avoiding this trap or ignoring wise counsel like Rehoboam did?
